Scissor skills are vital for young learners as they play a crucial role in enhancing fine motor skills, which are essential for various everyday activities. Learning to use scissors effectively requires coordination between hand muscles and visual perception, helping children develop precision and dexterity. Engaging in scissor activities not only strengthens hand eye coordination but also promotes bilateral coordination as children manipulate scissors with both hands. By providing opportunities for our KG children to refine their scissor skills, pave the way for holistic development ,equipping children with essential abilities that support their academic, artistic and everyday endeavors.

FUN LEARNING WITH WATER

As children become absorbed in an activity such as pouring water, the activity gradually helps lengthen their span of coordination. **Montessori activities** help children learn to pay attention to details and follow a regular sequence of action. Painting with water is also another such fun activity that we at **BFIS** engage our toddlers with. Holding painting tools helps strengthen the fingers and build fine motor skills of tiny tots. Painting with brushes on large surfaces such as walls or pavings develops gross motor skills. Our little ones enjoyed painting on the wall.


ORIENTATION PROGRAMS FOR PARENTS KINDERGARTEN AND SENIOR SCHOOL
